

WHCA Meeting Minutes November 8, 2006

Call to Order: 7:00 P.M.

Attendance: Chet Chaney, Cheryl Garrett, Chief Robert L. Oppenheimer, Officer John R. Thomas, Officer Gordon T. White, Jim Reardon, Tom Schwing, Karen Kramer, Carol Prosser, Doug Curran and Brian Bahnsen.

Secretary: Minutes from the October meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer: Brian Clark submitted via email a report detailing expenditures and income as of October 26. The report also indicated that Brian gave Dan Lacey the Association financial records to audit. The report was approved.

Police: Perry – Chief Oppenheimer thanked the residents of Worthington Hills for helping to pass the police levy. He also thanked Chet for passing out brochures on October 28.

Officer Thomas reported a quiet Halloween. He also reported a theft on Fairway Drive, in which someone apparently stole a check that was taped to the resident's front door; an assault on Blindbrook; a telephone harassment incident on Clubview North; and a burglary from a vehicle parked inside a garage – the vehicle contained two bottles of Percocet, the prescription to which the offender attempted unsuccessfully to refill at a local Kroger.

Sharon – Officer White reported a theft at Hills Market, a criminal mischief report at Hills Market; and a grand theft at the new Marathon station, where someone stole a backhoe. He also reported six traffic accidents over the past month.

Resident Relations: Carol reported that she met last week with neighborhood liaisons on the issue of how to streamline the membership drive. Cheryl suggested that we thank joining members in the March newsletter. She also suggested that we set a cut-off date for dues submission, so that dues do not trickle in throughout the year.

Carol also reported that we are currently twenty liaisons short.

Community Activities:

Red Cross Blood Drive – Jim indicated that this event is on schedule for November 27.

First Aid/CPR Class – Jim recommended that we not consider a first aid class until next year, as the CPR class is much more popular now.

Food Drive – Cheryl reported that the drive kicked off today and is off to a good start.

Web Site: Chet said he plans to invite the low bidder for web design to the December meeting.
